# **Merci Texas!**

This is not a motorcycle tale or recounting of two-wheel experiences. It is about accomplishing a long sought goal -to visit the Texas Capitol building that enabled positive serendipity.

Between too busy schedules in professional or personal life, or simply not finding a good time, we traveled to Austin to see our brood on February 18, 2017. Interestingly it was the unveiling and remembrance of the "The French Gratitude Train" or *the Texas Merci Boxcar*.


The tour of the Texas Capitol started like any other; I wanted to run through the place as quickly as I could to absorb it all and see it all!

I won't discuss or present the mindnumbing or tedious statistics, how high is it, what kind of stone is the building is made from. Instead, the **Texas Capitol building** represents the incredible power of the people, an anchoring permanence of who Texas is and who Americans are.

We strolled through and under the **Rotunda and Dome**, crossing through the business offices, reflecting on the contributions of historical persons, past and present, and I was humbled. Craning my neck to see the symmetry of design, the principled-centered poses of Stephen F. Austin in chiseled buckskin and Davy Crockett, to name a few, my thoughts rose above the din of children and tourists, and my neck got tired.



The visit to the Senate and House of Representatives Chambers were each under the watchful eyes of Texas leader portraits encouraging us to do what is right, not necessarily to do things right. I bid adieu to the likes of Lyndon Baines Johnson and Barbara Jordan.



Serendipity glinted outside the capitol - a memorial service by the Veterans of Foreign Wars recollecting the sacrifices of our Doughboy's in France during WWI, and more still in WWII. The accounting was somber but it was also uplifting because of the demonstrated exchange of friendship between the United States and France – in the near distance the **Texas Merci Boxcar** stood at attention.

In 1947 the people of France and Italy struggled to recover from the destruction visited on them during WWII. We, the Americans of many

creeds and races, sent an American Friendship Train with \$40 million in goods and supplies to assist them. In return, the Italians sent four statues now gracing the Theodore Roosevelt Memorial Bridge and the Arlington Memorial Bridge in Washington DC, including a short film that was played in the movie theaters ahead of any given feature, "Thanks, America!"

The French people, sent 49 boxcars filled with gifts from all corners of France. A ship adorned with the banner, "Merci America", arrived in New York Harbor in 1949. Congress passed a resolution allowing the gifts to enter duty-free; longshoremen volunteered their services to bring the boxcars ashore. Since the boxcars were too narrow in gauge for the American rails, they were loaded onto rail flatbeds and delivered to the state capitals across the country without charge.

Sadly, some of the French boxcars have succumbed to vandals and the vagaries of time and weather. Some survived like exceptional friendships testifying to comrades in arms and in Texas ours continues to stand together with the Goddess of Liberty overseeing, from the top of the Texas Capitol, the memorial service underway below.

We completed the day recounting our impressions of what we saw, and how our small family is connected, via circumstance, to Texas, by birth to the United States, by blood to Europe.

Before I left the capitol grounds I took one more look behind me at the building housing the **Texas Constitution**. I saw diversity and richness being forged through the unique foundry of time and history, into an amalgam that will be stronger and flexible.
