

I think now that I must have placed my Phone on the bike seat at the gas station and neglected to put it back in the appropriate pocket.



With a quick change in punctuation it becomes a deep philosophical discussion instead of generating plain and simple answers to a question. It's the freedom, excitement, feel and smells of the outdoors, or maybe the economic value of the motorcycle that fill our answers. And there have been several films produced that attempted to portray to the general public the irresistible urge to climb aboard our two-wheeled contraptions. One of the latest of such films was the 2013 motorcycle documentary "Why We Ride."

Back in November of 2013 the BMWDFW club took up a couple of rows of theater seats to see a special engagement of the film, "Why We Ride," some even took our non-riding SO's in hopes to share the passion. Writer, Producer, Director and 2014 American Motorcyclist Association Motorcyclist of the Year, **Bryan Carroll** made the documentary "Why We Ride" to share the passion and camaraderie of motorcycling friends and families that ride together. The film was independently financed with no corporate money allowed so Bryan could insure the motorcycling integrity of the film and it won several Best Documentary awards, a Family Choice award and multiple motorcycle film awards. Producer Bryan Carroll, banking on the popularity of the film came up with another idea to add to the list of reason as to Why We Ride. Benefiting a charity dear to his heart, the Pediatric Brain Tumor Foundation, Bryan started a fundraising effort and motorcycle ride - The Ride to the Quail Motorcycle Gathering.



more than 300 motorcycles on display and 3,000 guests in attendance the Quail Motorcycle Gathering truly has something for everyone! Entry is inclusive of a mouthwatering gourmet lunch, parking, and gear valet service for those riding a motorcycle to the event. Celebrating its eleventh anniversary on May 4, 2019. The celebration featured three specialty classes: marking 50 years since its first production date and the first production "Superbike" motorcycle, the Honda CB750; the 100th anniversary of the legendary Brough Superior; and historic pre-1990 off-road motorcycles. welcome, and manufacturers sent along some interesting bikes as well, sometimes showcasing vintage examples right alongside their modern counterparts.

This year's Quail coincided with the annual International Female Ride Day. Organizers added that feature to the day with onstage interviews of female riders. Now being an annual tradition at the Gathering, Female riders were invited onstage for a photo op and it looked like about 50 of them made it up on stage, to cheers from the crowd.

The highlight of the day, though, had to be the presentation of the AMA's Dud Perkins Lifetime Achievement Award to moto great Malcolm Smith. Malcolm remained nearby signing autographs, many on helmets and jackets and even a few motorcycles.

The Quail Motorcycle Gathering is what Pebble Beach was like for cars 50 years ago. There are no ticket scalpers, no impossible parking and impassible traffic. You can roll right up to the gate and park. "There are a lot of car guys who are secretly motorcycle guys," Quail organizer and Gordon McCall said. "And I will add that the motorcycle guys are almost never arrogant or hoity-toity about their enthusiasm or their motorcycles unlike the car people you may run into that at Pebble or Chantilly or Villa d'Este. Motorcycle guys are almost always good guys, unpretentious, happy to talk to you about whatever bike they rode."







I purchased a copy of the Why We Ride documentary soon after it was released on DVD and was sent a package that included a Pediatric Brain Tumor Foundation tshirt along with my DVD. About 5 years ago I received an invitation to the Why We Ride to the Quail Gathering. Bryan Carroll put together a 3-day ride taking the windy roads from the Simi Valley area north of Los Angles up through the Los Padres National Forest, back down to the Pacific Coast, overnighting in **Pismo Beach**. The following day the route takes **Hwy 101** and the Pacific Coast Highway and back up into the hills over the **Monterey Peninsula** and on to **Carmel**. The third day is spent at "The Quail: A Motorsport Gathering of Motorcycles".

I have wanted to attend the Quail ever since I read about it more than 10 years ago. And then 5 years ago when I received the Why We Ride invitation, the urge to knock California off my Bucket List grew stronger than ever. The main problem with my California/Quail bucket list run was that the Quail date always conflicted with a traditional family event we have in Houston. The proverbial straw-that-broke-the-camel's back was an additional invitation to the Quail for 2019. 100 people were invited to An Evening with **Peter Egan**, the former editor of both **Cycle World** and **Road & Track** magazines. The event was to be a gourmet dinner followed by a sit-down session with Peter Egan which was to include a ques-

tion-and-answer session from the audience. I had to go. And so glad I did. I was seated at a prominent table with 2 of the motorcycle show entry winners and I was also chosen from the audience to ask Peter a Question. My question: "Peter, did you ever get that Ah-ha moment when you realized that people love your stories and articles and that your writing was favored more than the average Joe writing about 'Where I rode on Summer Vacation'?" Peter said that "Though he's always appreciated the accolades he's received, he's really just written because he needed a job and writing was easier that hanging siding or rain gutters." Which is what he was doing right before he got the Cycle World magazine gig.

Assembling my gear for the trip, best laid plans immediately went a little awry when my BMW 1200RT started leaking oil just before I was to take to the highway for California. Repairs were taking longer than I had hoped, so I put my 1200RS on the trailer and drove to Palmdale California. I spent 2 days driving to Flagstaff Arizona, where I took an extra day to ride down to Sedona and back, 1 day driving to Palmdale where I dumped my truck and trailer and then 3 days on the Why We Ride to the Quail. After the Quail, I rode back to the Palmdale area and spent 2 days riding the hills above Los Angeles. The main road on the list was Angeles Crest Highway. I rode it late on a Sunday afternoon and luckily for me there was hardly any traffic. You could easily burn a week riding the Angeles Crest Highway and the side roads that peel away from it. I spent an extra day riding



up to Big Bear Lake and the Rim of the World Highway making me late on my schedule for the home run. I attempted to drive straight back from Palmdale and made it to Tucumcari New Mexico when I ran into the backside of an active Tornado-Warning on I-40 between Tucumcari and Amarillo. A cheap \$45 overnighter in Tucumcari made me fresh for the final leg home with a head full of fresh daydreams of California. I now see why many are so enamored that State. I got such a small taste and what a great taste it was. And you know the rest of California is still in my Bucket.

THERE & BACK AGAIN

On May 2, Mike Welch & I (both BMWDFW members) made a foray into New Mexico and Arizona along with Dave Calligan (former member) and Jon Davis. Mike, Jon & I rode from DFW area to Muleshoe TX, where we met Dave who had traveled from his home in south central CO. Not much to see or any good twisty roads getting there, although we did have about 1/2 hours of rain and 1/2 day of mist. Dave suffered through near freezing temps for half his ride.


On day 2 we motored on to Truth or Consequences NM. The roads were better than the previous day, but still nothing worthy of videoing. The evening in TorC found us each buying beer by the 36 oz pitcher,



but the restaurant wouldn't serve us after 3 each.

Day 3 was full of glorious riding. It started on NM152. If you haven't ridden this road, put it on your list. Going west it's uphill, but we had even more fun on the return trip going downhill. We headed up toward the Gila Cliff Dwellings. Our route included NM35 and NM15. On the way out, we decided to pass on the ride up to the actual cliff dwellings due to a line of RV's we would be following with no good opportunities to pass on the 30 miles to the park. We figured we'd have another chance on the return trip.

The last stretch of the day was the infamous "**Devil's Highway**" or **AZ191** as it is known on maps. It's 125 miles of twists and turns, going uphill from Morenci (5000 ft) to Alpine (8000 ft) and you get up to about 9500 ft along the way. Morenci is home of the worlds largest operating copper mine and there is a good scenic pullout to get photos and take it all in. We ended in Springerville AZ for the night.





On the Return to Springerville, we rode AZ273 and AZ261 just outside of Springerville off of AZ260. Those two roads are only about 30 miles total, but were scenic and enjoyable.



On day 5 we left Springerville and took AZ180 south, before repeating the NM15 ride toward the Cliff Dwellings. This time we went all the way to the park, it's about 30 miles each way, but the road is really fun; extremely twisty and hilly. Back on NM35, beware of a dip that almost sent Dave airborne. Going the speed limit the dip causes no issues, but we were going about double the 30 mph posted limit. Back on NM152, this time we were going mostly down hill, which required a lot of gear shifting and hard braking and caused significant hand strain. We overnighted in Las Cruces NM.

Day 6 started with a plan to ride back to Muleshoe TX for the night, but expected bad weather in DFW area and southern CO the following day caused

us to alter our plan and head straight

home. Dave headed north and the rest of us headed east. Mike and I made it all the way home, about 650 miles. Dave made it home to CO after about 500 miles. Jon stopped in Abilene, after 500 miles, and dealt with the rain the following day.
