

GIVE ME A WINDING ROAD

GOING WEST AND THEN NORTH

The United States of America (USA) is usually regarded as the richest country on earth and is divided into 50 states and one federal district, District of Columbia.

49 of these states and DC are in what is called the Continental United States of America and Hawaii (the remaining state) is a set of islands in the Pacific Ocean.

Since I started motorcycling in 2009, one of my dreams was to travel in all of the 49 continental states and DC. By 2016, I had visited 44 of these states and DC so I was missing 5 (Utah, Nevada, Idaho, North Dakota and South Dakota).


This article is about our trip to see these 5 states and more. We also decided that we

would take the opportunity to visit as many National Parks and significant State
Parks that we could. The USA has 62 protected areas known as National Parks where we can experience North
American heritage and in this trip we visited eleven national parks and two state parks.

Our trip took us on a tour from Texas to New Mexico then to Colorado and then we went West to Utah and Nevada, back to Utah, then North to Idaho, then East to Montana, Wyoming, North Dakota, South Dakota and then back south through Wyoming, Colorado, New Mexico and home to Texas.



We did the trip during the month of June, and were on the road for 20 days covering over 10,000 kms.

TEXAS and NEW MEXICO

June in Texas is extremely hot (temperatures can be above 40C) so we decided that we would trailer the bike from our home in Dallas, TX to the town of Raton in New Mexico, which is on the northern border of New Mexico just south of the Colorado state border. It turned out to be a good idea as on the way we got hammered by a huge summer storm.



As we left Texas going North West towards Amarillo, TX, my mind kept playing a song in my head - - -

Tony Christie's 1971 hit "On the Way to Amarillo"

"When the day is dawning

On a Texas Sunday morning

How I long to be there ... "

After 550kms, we arrived at our hotel and spent our first night in Amarillo, TX, the largest city in the Texas Panhandle and known as "The Yellow Rose of Texas" (as the city takes the name from the Spanish word for yellow).

The next day we had to do 350kms to arrive in Raton, NM. Just before leaving the Great State of Texas, we stopped at Dalhart, TX for a true Texas BBQ experience.

We arrived in Raton, NM mid-afternoon and took the bike from the trailer, left the car and trailer at the camping ground (where they would stay until we came back 3 weeks later) and made our way to see **Capulin Volcano**, the Sentinel of the Plains for 60,000 years. Born of fire and forces continually reshaping the earth's surface, the Capulin Volcano provides access to nature's most awe-inspiring work.



We wanted to ride the park road that goes up and around the mountain to give us a dramatic view of the landscape—a unique place of mountains, (extinct volcanos) plains, and sky.

Returning to Raton for dinner, we went to a local steakhouse, then checked into our hotel.

After a long day of driving and riding, at the end of the day we decided to take a stroll through the town.

COLORADO

Happy to be back on the bike, we were very excited to be entering one of the most enjoyable states in which to ride a motorcycle. We planned to stay the night in Gunnison, CO, but first there was lot to see in our forthcoming 400km day.

First we did **Raton Pass**. Both going up and the ride down towards Trinidad, CO is very beautiful. Just past Trinidad, we turned West and did the **Highway of Legends** (Colorado State Highway 12). It is a stretch of about 120kms and takes 2 hours to ride. Along this stretch of two-lane highway we viewed unusual volcanic formations radiating outward, like spokes in a wheel, from the direction of the **Spanish Peaks**. The highway rises up through **Cuchara Pass** and below the pass lies the glorious Village in **Cuchara Valley**.



Meandering through ranchland and forest, Highway 12 eventually leads to **Cokedale**, a National Historic District. Here we saw the surreal sight of what looks like something from the Roman Empire. The arching alcoves are actually the remnants of what used to be coke ovens used for smelting coal from the nearby mine. We had lunch in the **Dog Bar** a favorite for motorcyclists.

Then we rode North on Colorado Highway 69 towards Colorado Highway 50 which enters Colorado from Kansas on the high plains. It climbs the Rocky Mountains next to the Arkansas River and reaches the Continental Divide at **Monarch Pass.** Riding over it was the highlight of the day, but temperatures changed dramatically and we had to put on warmer clothes.

The Continental Divide is the principal, and largely mountainous, hydrological divide of the Americas, and separates the watersheds that drain into the Pacific Ocean from (1) those river systems that drain into the Atlantic Ocean (including those that drain into the Gulf of Mexico and the Caribbean Sea), and (2) along the northernmost reaches of the Divide, those river systems that drain into the Arctic Ocean.



We slept our third night in Gunnison, CO.

When we woke up on our fourth day, the sun was out and the birds were in full voice. Another 400 km day awaited us and we would be entering Utah, the first new state for us on this ride. It turned out to be one of the best days of riding through the most amazing terrain.

We started on Colorado Highway 92, which crosses over **Blue Mesa Dam** and then goes on the north part of the **Black Canyon** of Gunnison. It is a breathtaking ride, providing gorgeous views at every turn. We rode the **Black Canyon Road** and **Rim Road** to visit the first National Park on our trip, **The Black Canyon of Gunnison NP**.



The canyon is so named because parts of the gorge only receive 33 minutes of sunlight a day. "Several canyons of the American West are longer and some are deeper, but none combines the depth, sheerness, narrowness, darkness, and dread of the Black Canyon." The Rim Road provided access to 6 overlooks and we stopped at two of them where we could see the near vertical canyon walls on the North Rim in addition to some of the most impressive views found in the National Park.

And then we entered an all new world. It is difficult to explain it so, hopefully, photos will help.


Colorado Highway 141, also known as **Unaweep Tabeguache Scenic Byway** was one of the most "wow" roads we rode. Miles and miles of twisties with beautiful mountains on both sides. We just couldn't take enough pictures. At the time we rode it, I wrote, "We have been on many roads and this one makes it to the top 5." The road goes around numerous rock formations, knifing through the soft red sandstone of the Uncompangre Plateau. The canyon witnessed a copper boom a century ago, and decades later processed ore to produce uranium for the first atomic bombs. There's some natural power at work here.

The wide canyon walls narrow as you meet up with the Dolores River at **Gateway**, and then it hits you—you're on a motorcycle dream road.
